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## Director's Note

Forgiveness is about integrity. It's about keeping love intact, even though you've been hurt." ~Sister Helen Prejean

Certain scripts you find when you think you are ready for them and others find you. This is not my first outing with the brilliant book and lush score of Wheeler & Sondheim's "A Little Night Music". My first outing was at 25 - just young enough in life and the ways of the world to be a perfect recipient of Madame Armfeldt's 1st Smile of the Summer Night's honorific: the young who know nothing. As young ones who fall hopelessly in over their heads in love, I couldn't imagine life beyond the moment I was in and I was the ultimate source of my own time-stopping heartbreak. Of course, at that time, who of us could truly see the ripple of our own actions and how many multitudes we possess to be able to choose our own happiness?

But time passes, choices clarify, and, if we embrace it, we get a brilliant chance to hold up a mirror and see ourselves in all of our scar-covered beauty in every decade. And - if we dare - we hold ourselves accountable for the wrongs we've done unto others and the ways that we've stood in the way of our own heart. Desirée gets this chance as the opening strains of this magnificent show's most famous song begins. She chooses happiness. She goes all in. She dares to let go of fear and to release the pain that keeps a past loved one close, for the chance at healing, forgiveness, and her heart's desire. While many couples tangle in its magical web over the course of one Midsummer evening under the midnight Sun, there is another love story that is so solid and bright that we just might miss it: The love of a Grandmother, Mother, and Granddaughter. A love that is also in need of healing and making right past wrongs in order to shed light on the hauntings of past generational traumas.

When I was asked to direct this piece for Marblehead Little Theatre, the above words of Sr. Helen Prejean, uttered off the cuff with humble brilliance while reaching for a tater tot, popped into my head. Keeping love intact requires vulnerability, ownership, and forgiveness. While I might solidly be at the second summer night's smile for the fools who know too little at 40, I am honored to have had this show find me again to hold up that proverbial mirror.

May we all find a pocket full of happiness each day where we are grateful for the loves of our lives: the ones we are with and the ones that ran their course and allowed us to grow into perfectly imperfect multitudes of ourself.

With humble gratitude to this incredibly brave cast and this amazingly collaborative team of Creatives and Crew who took a risk and believed in our little peekaboo world just through the garden there,


